Be Waterwise and Weed Free

MILLCREEK. The weather is downright HOT, people are sporting their lightest summer clothing, and our lawn and gardens are feeling the heat.

The weather forecasts have become a bit of a broken record: hot, slightly less hot, or “near normal” (which still means hot)--not much rain in the foreseeable future.

With all of Utah in a drought, it's more important than ever to be waterwise--not only when it

comes to watering our lawns and gardens, but also inside our homes.

You can find some great waterwise projects designed to save water and potentially get you some water rebates on the [Slow the Flow website](#) or find waterwise plants on the [Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District website](#).

WEEDS. The city has been receiving a great number of complaints about the condition of yards throughout the city. During these scorching days we can expect our lawns to have some dry patches that aren't quite as lush and green as we would like. We appreciate those who are doing their part to conserve water during this drought. What we hear most about is **weeds**.

- City ordinance [9.60.010 Responsibility To Keep Property Clean](#) states that *"It is unlawful for any person, corporation, partnership or legal entity owning or occupying real property in the city to let the height of weeds on such property to grow beyond the maximum permitted, or to fail to remove from the property any such weeds or refuse, unsightly or deleterious objects or structures, and after having been given written notice by the city or the health department"*.
- [Section 9.60.020 Weed Control Standards](#) sets the maximum height of weeds at six inches and requires that all cuttings be removed.

Our Millcreek Code Officers are very busy responding to weed complaints along with their other duties. While they don't typically drive through neighborhoods looking for violations, they visit each property when a complaint has been filed. These officers are highly sensitive to conditions that may have caused the problem and do their best to help the responsible parties resolve the issue. 

At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
